

MODERN SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING STATEMENT Year ended 31st July 2020

INTRODUCTION

Modern slavery and human trafficking remains a hidden blight on our global society. We all have a responsibly to be alert to the risks, however small, in our business and in the wider supply chain. Staff are expected to report concerns and management are expected to act upon them.

ORGANISATION'S STRUCTURE AND PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

Crown Oil Limited is a privately owned company, which is also a parent company to several wholly owned subsidiaries. The group has its head office in the UK and all trading outlets are in the UK.

The group's principal activities are fuel oil distribution, provision of environmental services, supply of mains gas, and infrastructure installations.

OUR SUPPLY CHAIN

Our supply chain includes the sourcing of bulk fuel oil and gas from UK suppliers, and multi utility connection services from UK suppliers.

OUR POLICIES ON MODERN SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

We are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chain or in any part of our business.

Our modern slavery policy reflects our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls to ensure modern slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in our supply chain.

DUE DILIGENCE PROCESSES FOR MODERN SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

With regards to national or international supply chains, our point of contact is preferably with a UK company and we expect these entities to have suitable modern slavery and human trafficking policies and processes.

We expect each entity in the supply chain to, at least, adopt 'one-up' due diligence on the next link in the chain. It is not practical for us (and every other participant in the chain) to have a direct relationship with all links in the supply chain.

SUPPLIER ADHERENCE TO OUR VALUES

We have zero tolerance to modern slavery and human trafficking. We expect all those in our supply chain and contractors comply with our values. The group will not support or deal with any business knowingly involved in modern slavery or human trafficking.

TRAINING

To ensure a high level of understanding of the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our supply chains and our business, we provide training to relevant members of staff. All directors have been briefed on the subject.

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes Crown Oil Limited and its group's modern slavery and human trafficking statement for the current financial year.
